When evaluating and testing children with disabilities psychological and educational testing tools are used that can offer valuable insights to the therapist. In this workshop a seasoned diagnostician will present data from the WISC the Wechsler Intelligence Scale and the WWPSI (Woodcock Johnson). Special emphasis will be placed on subtest imparting information relevant to the occupational and physical therapist and speech and language pathologist. Recommendations will include how to utilize these results to determine what other instruments are appropriate for testing and to design treatment and program plans for an individual child.
